

TOWN OF CAMBRIDGE
Guidelines for Candidates, Campaign Workers and Voters
17 V.S.A. §2508

The entire Cambridge Elementary School & Gymnasium building is considered the polling place. The following guidelines shall apply on any day when the polls are open.

No campaigning or discussion of the election may take place inside the Cambridge Elementary School & Gymnasium.

No campaign materials, including buttons, leaflets, signs or clothing are permitted to be displayed on or in the building. Voters may carry a small information card or list of candidates for their own use, but may not show it to any other voter. Campaign clothing and other displays must be covered when worn inside the building.

Political signs are not allowed on town property, including parking lots, on any day other than election day. On the day of the election only, one sign per candidate may be placed at the Cambridge Elementary School, on the grass on the left side of the main gymnasium entrance sidewalk. Signs must be no larger than 2' x 3', and must be removed the same day.

No one may impede the progress of a voter. Candidates and/or campaign workers may stand outside the polling place, but must stay on the grass on the left side of the main gymnasium entrance sidewalk. No candidates or campaign workers may stand on the sidewalks or street leading to the polling place, or in the parking area. Candidates and/or campaign workers may be asked to remove their cars from the parking lot if the parking area becomes too congested.

Poll watchers are permitted inside the polling place and must remain in the designated observation area (behind the guardrail). They must not interrupt the election officials or the election process. Observers are also free to watch the counting process.
